ASSISTED SUICIDE BILL

A heartfelt plea is being made to us as time is short, to voice our opposition to the new bill on assisted suicide being debated in Parliament that will, if passed shortly, permit physicians to administer lethal drugs to individuals suffering from incurable illnesses. The plea stresses that the concern over the bill is not limited to religious communities but applies to all people of goodwill. All human life is sacred, and this message is not just for people of faith, but for all people of goodwill, because the proposals for physician-assisted suicide are not just contrary to the dignity and sanctity of life, they pose grave dangers to vulnerable people. Cherishing life means building a society where every person is included, and the diversity of individuals is not seen as a burden. There are examples from countries where assisted suicide has been legalised, such as Belgium, the Netherlands, and the United States and the potential risks that vulnerable individuals might feel pressured into making irreversible decisions. In Oregon over 47 per cent of those who accepted assisted suicide cited being a burden on family, friends, and caregivers as a reason. We are being urged to act and write to, or email our local

MP, and express our concerns about the bill. There's information on the *Right to Life UK* website, including a guide on how to do this. Time is getting short so please continue to pray at this critical time at home, here in Mass, during Adoration on Thursday and the Rosary after Mass on Wednesday.

HOLY HOUR FOR THE DIGNITY OF THE HUMAN PERSON St Michael's, Wednesday 13th November, 5.30pm to 6.30pm

Next week, the Bishops of England & Wales gather in Leeds for the Autumn Plenary Meeting. On Wednesday 13th, at 5.30pm, they will gather for a Holy Hour for prayer to promote the dignity of the human person and the culture of life in our countries in the face of the assisted suicide legislation before the UK Parliament.

Bishop Richard is encouraging all parishes to join them at this time. We will be praying for this intention at St Michael's from 5.30pm to 6.30pm and warmly invite the parish to come and pray.
